I can feel it. I suspect that you can too. Hope. A sense that we might get through this, that something that we recognize as normal might return and might return soon. Many children will be returning to full time school in the next month. More and more things are opening up. With more

people getting vaccinated, people are starting to do things that they haven't done in a year. Eat in a restaurant, go to a gym, plan a trip, come to communion at church, so many things that, during the hard and frightening winter that we're coming out of, seemed like a distant dream.

Of course, things can never go back to exactly the way that they were. We've lost too many people. We've lost too much. We're all going to come out of this time scarred in some way, some more than others. But we're also going to come out of this time having learned some things about what is really important in life and about how to care for each other in new ways. Many of us will also come out of this time having learned to use some new technology, that has helped us to stay connected with each other, with work, with worship, with family during this time.

With the sense of the things opening up and with the feeling of hope in the air, many people have started to ask when we will be getting back to in person worship. Of course, we have been worshipping in person at Emmanuel since June 14th, when we had our first Communion in the Courtyard services and we've been worshiping in the building since the weather required us to move those outdoor communion services indoors on November 15th. But I know what people mean when they ask when we're getting back to in person worship. What they're really asking is, when will worship go back to looking like it looked in 2019 and early 2020, back to what worship looked like for most of our lives before this pandemic came along and turned every aspect of our lives upside down. The quick answer is, "I don't know." We don't have a timeline yet. But rest assured that that is the next thing that we're going to be doing as a congregation. We will celebrate resurrection during our Zoom Easter service and then we will focus our attention on experiencing a kind of resurrection in terms of our in-person worship life. There are a lot of things that we need to consider during the process though. Obviously, health and safety continue to be our number one concern, as we take into consideration the fact that, while many of us have been vaccinated, many are still waiting for their turn. Even when we get back to in person worship it might not look like what we're used to right away. We also need to consider all of the ways in which our online worship services have been a blessing to many people who either don't live in the area or who aren't able to come to in person worship services for other reasons. I imagine that our future will include some kind of ongoing communal Zoom worship offering, though I'm not exactly sure what that will look like. There are a lot of questions and a lot of things that we need to figure out, but still, I can feel it. Hope. This is the next thing that we're going to work on and I'm excited to see how our coming back together will unfold.

Here's a crazy thing. I haven't preached a sermon while standing up since March 8, 2020. I miss that. I miss being in the pulpit. I miss seeing the Sanctuary full. I miss singing with you. I miss placing communion in your hand. I miss having someone give me communion. I miss you. Even though we have found many ways of being together safely during this time, ways that have been, deeply meaningful, I still miss the in-person fellowship that we share. And getting back to that is what's next. So, it is with a different kind of hope and confidence that I write the words that I first wrote on March 15th, the first Sunday when we were not able to be together in the building, "Until we meet again, peace be with you."

#### **Faith Formation**

Growing in faith has also been continuing in new and different ways.

**Confirmation Class:** The 2020-2021 Confirmation class is currently participating in Lenten Evening Prayer as its weekly activity. Students in the class have served as

our "Designated Responders" for most of the Evening Prayer services. On Super Bowl Sunday and the week before and after the Confirmation class raised money for the Souper Bowl of Caring. We are staggered by the generosity of the members and friends of Emmanuel! \$1,705.41 was raised to help fight hunger! That's the highest amount that the Confirmation class has ever received for this effort, by far! Once the Confirmation class is meeting for regular classes again, they will decide what hunger fighting organizations will receive the money. We'll keep you posted about where the money is donated.

Sunday School: For Valentine's Day, the Sunday School children completed a small art project that was delivered to Emmanuel's homebound members called the Healing Envelope. The Healing Envelope is a place to keep short prayers that are written on strips of paper. At a special time, each day or each week, the person can open their envelope and read the prayers, add to their prayers, pray for the child that created their envelope, etc. It is often a way to bring worries or concerns to God but can also be about happy things, prayers for people we love, upcoming events, prayers for wider issues, etc.

During the **Lenten season**, for the Heifer International program, the children will assist in suggesting language for a mission fund request to Heifer International which will be sent to the Mission Fund Team. The children will also vote on which animal program they would like to support.

For **Easter**, the parents will take a photo of their children holding "Happy Easter" signs and email them to Cindy Zafft. Cindy will print out the photos and place them on cardstock paper which will be delivered to Emmanuel's homebound members in time for Easter. Also, on April 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm, Rebecca Sol will be hosting via Zoom, the award-winning Spark Story Bible video called "The Story of Easter". The video uses

spirited animation to help children marvel at God's love for the work through the death and resurrection of Jesus. The video brings the story to life with colorful animation and with Squiggles, an expressive caterpillar whose reactions put children right in the middle of the story.

On May 2<sup>nd</sup>, during Zoom Sunday School, Pastor Amanda will host "Ask the Pastor" for a question-and-answer session. This is a wonderful opportunity for both Pastor Amanda as well as the children to ask whatever questions that are on their curious minds.

With all of the ways that we have had to change and adapt our Friday Night Live gatherings two things about them remains the same week after week. We always pray together and we always share highs and lows!

#### Service

The Quilting Group: The "Piecemakers" of Emmanuel are about to begin their 12<sup>th</sup> season of quilting! Normally, the group begins meeting in February and we work right up until the week before Easter. This year it will be different. (Surprise! Surprise!)

Because the COVID pandemic has kept us from gathering at church, many of us have continued to work on quilts at home. In fact,

the group has been so industrious that we have a ton of quilts ready to be assembled when we finally are able to meet together in Kask Hall. We have stayed in touch with Pastor and the Congregational Council regarding our start-up date and are prepared to begin our work following Easter. By then, at least 9 of us (and, perhaps, more) will be fully vaccinated. We will, however, continue to adhere to the COVID safeguards by wearing masks and limiting the number of workers who can be present at any given quilting session. The specific details will be worked out between now and Easter. We are looking forward to resuming our work for Lutheran World Relief—and to gathering together for our unique form of fun and fellowship!

#### **The Property Corner**

It continues to be a busy time around the Emmanuel building. Here's a bit of what's been and IS happening in and outside the building.

Second Bathroom Renovation - The time has finally come to re-do the pink-and-brown bathroom! We have gutted the space, and now need to prepare it for tiling. This includes installing backing boards in the walls for the inset paper towel and toilet paper dispensers, doing some minimal plumbing to get rid of some old water lines that are no longer used, and cutting a nice straight line along the walls.

We may have some wait for a tiler, as I'm hoping to get the same person that did the men's room. Tile for the room was purchased already at the same time we did the men's room, so the two spaces will match. A nice green paint will go up on the walls. It is hoped to have the bathroom done in the next 2 months, knowing we will be waiting on the tiler.

**Kitchen** - We have hot water!!! After a long time suffering with lukewarm water, we have solved the problem. A faulty "mixing valve", installed in the worst possible location behind the hot water heater in the janitor's closet appeared to be the culprit. The hot water heater had to be removed (water drained, copper pipes cut), the mixing valve cut out and new copper piping installed. It has seemed to do the trick!

So the two sinks by the windows now have hot water. The sink on your left by the refrigerator when you walk in the kitchen from the hallway still has a mixing valve in front of it. This is to prevent too hot water in case a child washes his or her hands at that sink.

Also PLEASE NOTE! Regarding the sink with the rinsing wand – please always shut off the hot and cold-water handles – don't rely on the wand to turn the water off. If the hot or cold levers are left on, this can cause a situation where cold water is drawn through the system and will mix with another sink's hot water! Very strange, but it's really a thing. This may have been part of the issues we had been having in the kitchen.

LED Lighting Conversion Project -For many months now, John Gear and Joy Peter have been swapping out old florescent lighting on the NCNS side of the basement, and have updated most of the incandescent upstairs fixtures as well. The project is nearing completion. As noted above, Kask Hall is already done. Half of the cost of the materials will be paid by a grant from Norwood Light. In addition, the LED fixtures are newer, safer, more attractive, and use less energy than the old fixtures. We find many cases of singed insulation when removing some of the old

1950s fixtures. We have been given an extension, but hope to wrap up soon.

Tree Work - We will be removing the severely damaged tree on Gardner Road by the sidewalk, and trimming the tree on the corner. The lovely large maple in the courtyard has some rot in its center. We will begin by trying to trim the center section beyond the rot. If at that time, the arborist says it can't be saved, we'll probably make the difficult decision to remove the tree. Hopefully it won't come to that, and we can get more years of its company.

NCNS Basement window replacement - This important project will continue as we replace the old single-pane steel windows with Harvey vinyl windows. These old windows are really unsafe for a preschool, allow a lot of heat loss, cannot be opened and are difficult to maintain. It is a big job to remove the old windows, as their frames were set in the concrete as the foundation was poured in the 1950s.

Norwood Cooperative Nursery School is splitting the cost of this project. An additional 19 windows have already been ordered, and will be installed when school is out.

**Sanctuary Refresh -** We are gathering bids to determine the cost to paint the Sanctuary, refinish the floors, and replace carpet. It's our most important gathering place, and although it will be expensive, we're hoping to raise funds to do this project while we are not using the building. It is a large undertaking, starting with removing all the pews!

#### **Holy Week Schedule**


March 28<sup>th</sup> - Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion Zoom Worship at 9:30 a.m.

Communion 2:00 p.m. (Sanctuary) and 3:00 p.m. (Kask Hall)



John witnesses to the culmination of Jesus' ministry: God's glory in the cross.
