# How are we, at Emmanuel, going to celebrate Christmas this year?

I usually start my Envoy article with a quote from the Bible, that has something to do with what my article is about. I thought about doing that again for this article, but then I realized, there is nothing in the Bible about celebrating Christmas. Of course, the stories that shape, at least the church/religious part of our Christmas celebration are found

in the Bible, in the gospels of Matthew, Luke, and John but there is nothing in the rest of the New Testament about the early Christians celebrating Christmas. So, I couldn't find a scripture verse that spoke to what has been on my mind a lot in recent months which is, "How are we, at Emmanuel, going to celebrate Christmas this year?"

Of course, I knew as December approached, that Christmas would look a lot more like past Christmases at Emmanuel and in our home, than last Christmas did, but I also knew that we probably weren't going completely back to the "way it used to be." The challenging reason for that is that we are still in the midst of a pandemic. Readily available vaccines for all except the youngest among us has made it possible for us to gather together in person again for many things, but we have still needed to take precautions, like mask wearing and distancing, to do what we can to protect young, unvaccinated children and people with compromised immune systems and to prevent breakthrough infections. The more joyful reason that Christmas 2021 won't look exactly like Christmas 2019, the last Christmas when things were "normal", is that this pandemic has given us the opportunity to create a new ministry. Zoom worship, which started as a necessity, has become a blessing, that enables us to include more people in our worship services, including people who do not live in our area and people who face health issues who might find it difficult or dangerous to gather in-person for worship.

As we've been heading into December the Worship Team, the Executive Committee, and the whole Church Council has been talking about how we should handle Christmas worship this year. As you probably know, Christmas Eve worship, especially our 5:00 p.m. service usually packed with people, with 150-170 people over the years, crammed into our sanctuary. It's a beautiful and inspiring thing to see so many people gathered to celebrate Jesus' birth. But this year, it seemed like a challenging thing. How could we handle that kind of crowd? We've talked about the possibility of removing the "every other pew" seating parameter that we've had since we reopened back in July, but ultimately, the Council decided this is not the right time to do that. After much discussion, thought, and prayer, the Council finally decided that the best way that we could handle Christmas Eve would be to have two in-person Christmas Eve services with limited capacity and ask people so make reservations to attend those services. We will also have a Zoom Christmas Eve service available as well.

So, here is how Christmas Eve (and Christmas Day) will work this year:

The link for Christmas Day worship will be emailed out in the days prior to Christmas Day.

We've made provisions to be able to have space available so that who might get the message to reserve their space for worship can be included in Christmas Eve in-person worship. But if you're reading this article and getting Emmanuel's emails, you're not one of those people. So, please reserve your space for Christmas Eve worship. Do it now, before you forget, though, rest assured, you'll be getting lots of reminders over the next 21 days to make a reservation if you're planning on coming for in-person worship on Christmas Eve.

I am so excited about worshiping with you for the rest of this Advent and during the Christmas season in-person and on Zoom. Even though things still look a little bit different than what we remember from before the pandemic, there are still all kinds of signs of God working in us and through us and for us during these seasons and celebrations. I'm grateful for all of the ways that we can be together to celebrate Christ's birth this year.

May we all have a blessed and holy Advent and a joyful and grateful Christmas!

# **Update from "The Piecemakers"**

The Piecemakers have decided to begin their work a bit earlier than usual in the upcoming



season, which will mark our 13th year of quilting. Our first session will be held on **Saturday, January 8, 2022**, from 9 to noon. There are

already many quilt tops in Kask Hall just waiting to be assembled, so we thought we would get a head start this year.

And, in order to provide guidance to anyone who would like to create a quilt top or learn how to hem an assembled quilt, we will have an informational session on the afternoon of **Saturday, January 15**, so that some of our more experienced members can share tips on how to choose fabric, how to measure and cut fabric, and how to seam pieces together. There will also be a demonstration of how to properly tuck quilt corners while sewing a zig-zag hem to finish a quilt.

In the past 12 years, The Piecemakers have made a total of 1,026 quilts. At this point, we are actively recruiting new members. If you know of someone who might enjoy being a part of this group, please ask that person to reach out to Susan Lawson at lawsue51@verizon.net or at

508-259-1062. Our circle is ready to expand and we are particularly hoping to attract a couple of talented seamstresses to assist with the work of hemming our quilts. That being said, participants do not need to know how to sew and all ages, from teens to seniors, are welcome!
