

On May $31^{\rm st}$ the congregation shared words of scripture and blessings for Pastor Amanda as she set forth on her sabbatical. We also said words

that we as a congregation would "commit to using our gifts for the building up of this congregation and for the sharing of the good news of God with our neighbors near and far". And that is exactly what we've done over these past three months, and it hasn't been the work of one or two but the work of many, each doing their part.

The following is some of the things that have occurred:

- The big maple tree in our courtyard, as well as a few other trees on our property, were removed or were pruned.
- The yews that bordered the front stairs leading to the sanctuary were removed and their removal has opened the area to form what will become a meditation garden.
- The work on that garden is ongoing, at present it is mostly happening behind the scenes by several members of the congregation; soon there will be opportunities for others to assist in making this dream a reality.
- In June we had our first ever hybrid congregation meeting and while there are improvements to be had with that format the meeting went well and was well attended.
- We've done some clean-up and disposal of items within the building.
- We've heard sermons on God's word from different voices and we've continued to greet friends new and old at our worship services (both in-person and via Zoom).
- Different members of the congregation acted as host to our visiting pastors and others have written the opening paragraph for the weekly worship link email.
- Wednesday night prayer group was led by various lay members and welcomed new faces.
- Our eucharistic ministry that brings communion to those who are unable to come to the church continued and was coordinated by a member of the congregation.

- As of today, we've logged over 2100 miles (that's from here to Denver, CO) in support of Calumet's *Walk the Walk*.
- We cared for members of our community who were ill by prayers, cards, phone calls, and visits.
- And last, but far from least, the unending work in the office continued, supported by several members of our community.

In a few short weeks Pastor Amanda will return from her sabbatical, rested, recharged, and full of new ideas and new experiences to share with us. And we will be greeting her with our own new experiences and new thoughts. Things won't be quite the same here either as we'll be starting a revised worship schedule, new Sunday school schedule and hosting our first potluck breakfast in 3 ½ years! All of this happens on September 11th. But that is not the end of what will be coming as, among other things, we plan our Luciafest and we begin to think about and plan for 2023 and Emmanuel's 125th anniversary celebration.

There is much to look forward to but there is even more to be thankful for. I am thankful for this community. This community that works so well together and supports each other in so many varied ways. Thank you for all that you are and thank you for the work that each and every one of us does to lift up this community, this church, and these people.

A Letter from the Finance Ministry Team

It's hard to believe Labor Day is nearly upon us. As summer winds down, your Finance Ministry Team would like to share a few updates with you.

Our year-to-date (YTD) giving always dips in the summer as members and friends take vacation. Our YTD giving is strong at 95% of pledged amounts through July, though the month of July dipped to 77%. As you return from summer vacations and start planning for fall activities, FMT would like to ask you to check on the status of your pledge/planned giving for the year. Third quarter statements will not be available until early October, but if you have any questions about your giving for the year, please contact Kendra Lassen, at financialsecretary@emmanuelnorwood.org.

It has been a very hot and dry summer as everyone knows, which makes it hard to believe that our YTD spend on fuel oil is already over budget and projected to end the year significantly over budget. With that in mind, we are proactively asking members and friends to consider an extra gift to help offset that cost. We have been fortunate to generate operating budget surpluses for the last few years, and those surpluses have been needed to help balance our budget in the following year. We hope to diminish the impact of the increase in fuel costs now.

There is a dedicated giving button online for the current operating budget and we have established one specifically for giving towards fuel oil.
